Although these are great numbers compared to the 1990s when the first Women in Ophthalmology Summer Symposium was held, it is lower than percentages in other specialties and recently we have seen slower growth and even regression. In addition, women lag in areas of leadership where they are underrepresented as full professors, department chairs, program directors, principal investigators in large trials, practice owners, and chief officers in health care and industry. BARBARA J. ARNOLD, MD, FACS

Sacramento's Fairy Godmother and one of WIO's founders of the annual Summer Symposium

The Inside Sacramento Magazine ran a story on Dr. Barbara Arnold in August of 2020 written by Jessica Laskey, aptly titled, "Sacramento's Fairy Godmother: Eye Doctor Sets her Sights on Philanthropy".

"Giving back has been the driving force of Dr. Barbara Arnold's life. The celebrated ophthalmologist has generously donated her time, money, and wisdom for decades – which she believes is the key to a life well lived. As a volunteer, Dr. Arnold has served as a volunteer faculty member at the UC Davis Eye Clinic for the past 38 years. And she donates a piece of art to the KVIE Art Auction each year – she won Best in Show her first time out in 2016 – and to the Crocker Art Museum's annual "Big Names, Small Art" fundraising exhibition.

After earning her medical degree from the University of Colorado – she was the first woman accepted into the school's ophthalmology training program – and serving four years with the U.S. Air Force as a flight surgeon, Dr. Arnold decided to open a medical practice in Sacramento in 1981. She specifically chose to locate her office in the south area to serve (where she was needed).

When she started attending Fairytale Town (a children's play park) with her two grandchildren, she noticed the park needed some TLC – so she donated to help the park make capital improvements."

Many WIO attendees know Dr. Arnold as one of WIO's founders of the annual Summer Symposium and the art teacher for the Live Well sessions. Dr. Arnold is honored to receive the WIO Bernice Z. Brown Memorial Lecture Award, and she is looking forward to sharing her story, earning a medical degree in 1968 when there were so few women in the field, going into private practice in 1972, and going on to help create a space for woman ophthalmologists to gather, collaborate, advocate, be seen and heard, when she helped found the WIO Summer Symposium in 1998.

FASIKA A. WORETA, MD, MPH

Dr. Fasika Woreta is currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Ophthalmology and the Eugene de Juan Professor of Ophthalmic Education at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. She received her M.D. degree from the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and M.P.H. degree from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. She completed her internship in internal medicine at the Johns Hopkins Hospital, followed by an ophthalmology residency at the Wilmer Eye Institute and a corneal fellowship at Bascom Palmer Eye Institute.

Dr. Woreta returned to Wilmer to serve as the fourth female Assistant Chief of Service from 2013 to 2014 and has been heavily involved in medical education since then. She serves as the ophthalmology residency director, Vice Chair of Education, and Director of the Eye Trauma Center at the Wilmer Eye Institute. Her national leadership roles include being chair of the National Medical Association Ophthalmology section, President of the Program Directors Council of the Association of University Professors of Ophthalmology, immediate past-present of the American Society of Ophthalmic Trauma, President-Elect of the Maryland Society of Eye Physicians and Surgeons, and chair of the Women in Ophthalmology Academic Outreach Committee.

Dr. Woreta has been the recipient of several awards including the Johns Hopkins Physician of the Year Award, the Johns Hopkins Institute for Excellence in Education Teaching Award, the Wilmer Eye Institute Most Promising Assistant Professor Award, and the Women in Ophthalmology Educators Award, and the Real World Ophthalmology Ophthalmologist of the Year Award.

Dr. Woreta has over 180 peer-reviewed publications in areas related to diversity, equity and inclusion, medical education, ophthalmic trauma, and quality improvement. She has been a passionate advocate for increasing diversity, equity and inclusion in ophthalmology and is currently co-chair of the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Subcommittee of the Committee for Resident Education, chair of the DEI Committee of Cornea Society, a mentor in the Minority Ophthalmology Mentoring Program and Rabb-Venable Excellence in Research Program, and director of the Wilmer Summer Scholars Program for rising second year medical student without home ophthalmology programs or from financially disadvantaged backgrounds. She has mentored dozens of female medical students and residents over the last decade and has contributed to the formation of pathways programs to increase diversity in our field.




CAROLE FOOS, CPA






TRAN NGUYEN, DO






ANNIE NGUYEN, MD




RAMYA SWAMY, MD, MPH

practice, she is actively involved in resident and fellow training. Dr. Xia also participates in clinical research through her practice.




BARBARA YATES, MD


